

Duck Derby on July 18 to raise funds for St. Tammany Humane Society

The St. Tammany Duck Derby is set to kick off this month on the Northshore.

Games, food and plenty of fun will begin at 10 a.m. July 18 over at Bogue Falaya Park. Proceeds from the **Duck Derby** benefit the St. Tammany Humane Society.

According to the St. Tammany Humane Society website, the non-profit animal welfare is one of the largest in the state. It was established in 1953 and has been serving the Northshore and southeast Louisiana.

"We rely solely on the support of caring people like you to fund programs and services that profoundly benefit the animals of our community," the STHC said on its website.

People interested in participating in the Duck Derby can purchase various sets of rubber ducks. The STHC has set a goal of 5,000 rubber ducks.

Each rubber duck costs \$5. On race day, the participant with the rubber duck that finishes first will win the \$1,000 top prize.
